**ABOUT THE COLLEGE**

Dyal Singh College owes its origin to the generosity of Sardar Dyal Singh Majithia who willed his vast wealth for setting up an education trust. Born at Kashi, Sardar Dyal Singh Majithia (1848-1898) had an illustrious career. He was appointed Honorary Magistrate of Amritsar in 1869 and launched the newspaper 'The Tribune' in 1881. He was a pioneer in the field of education and was a great devotee of knowledge. A scholar of Persian, a poet, an excellent sitar player, a great orator and patron of fine arts as well as sports. Our revered patron was known for his spirit of enquiry, breadth of vision, and a fine discriminating intellect.

Dyal Singh College was first established at Lahore, then at Karnal after partition. The college started functioning in Delhi as a constituent college of the University of Delhi in 1959. Today it is a University of Delhi maintained College. The



College, with a campus spread over 11 acres, has an accomplished faculty of over 200, 100 staff members and a cosmopolitan student body of over 3300, including students from Congo, Afganistan, Sudan, Jordan, Bangladesh, Tibet, Iran and Nepal. The college offers facilities and courses in Computer education, Commerce, Humanities and Sciences. Alumni of the College are well placed in public and private sector enterprises, in medicine, business, services and many of them are elected representatives of the people.

The college boasts of a fully functional forty computer lab and an electronics lab which aids the students in their academic endeavors.

In the present academic session, the College Auditorium has been made fully functional and the installation of the disabled friendly lift is under progress. The college now has a new synthetic basket ball court and the security lights around the college have been installed. In addition, a new state of the art computer lab to accomodate 80 computers is under renovation.

Keeping in step with the need to use more environment friendly materials, 7 bamboo classrooms have been constructed. The construction of the new Science block of 7000 sq. mts. is presently going on under the OBC expansion programme.

The college has a total collection of aprx. 90,000 and subscribes to 54 Journals / Magazines & 18 News Papers. The library reading room is under Wi-fi system.



## STAFF ACHIEVEMENTS

Our faculty members, in addition to their academic responsibilities, have been actively engaged in various research activities which include publishing research papers, book writing, participation & presentation of research papers at various conferences and seminars. Some have also attended different workshops pertaining to the changes incorporated by the University of Delhi in some courses. Two of our faculty members, Dr. Naveen Gaur and Dr. Aruna Chhikara got research grants from UGC and DBT for Rs. 4.59 lakhs and Rs. 11.68 lakhs respectively.

Two of our College Teachers, **Dr. P. Chitrlekha**, (Botany Department) and **Mr. Anshuman Singh** (English Department) were felicitated by the University as teachers of distinction on September 7, 2009.

The NSS organized three Blood Donation camps this year and conducted discussions by experts on the issues of Climate change and Global warming. As part of concern for the gender issue, discussions were held on the widows and the farmers suicides in Punjab. Some of the NSS volunteers are also gearing up to teach abandoned and homeless children,



housed and raised by Jamghat (a NGO) during their summer break.

**Sports :** The performance of our sportspersons under the guidance of Ms. Nirmal Taneja and Mr. Sandeep Mehta, DPE, has been spectacular and the college has made a vital contribution in the field of sports and games. In Boxing, the College won the Inter College Boxing Championship with 4 gold, 2 silver and 2 bronze medals. Our students Ganesh Tokas, Shatruntap Rawat, Jitender Mann, Ashwani Ghallot won the gold, Guddu Kumar, Shashwat Vashishth won the silver, Harish Solanki and Sidharth Tokas won the bronze in different weight category in the Inter College Boxing Championship. Jitender Mann won the gold Medal in Delhi state and was selected to represent Delhi in the 56<sup>th</sup> National Championship in Hyderabad. In Athletics, our college secured a total 6 medals in the Inter College tournament. In the Pole vault Hitesh won the gold and Vinay won the silver medal. In High Jump Sumit won the silver and the bronze in the 110 m hurdle. In Decathlon, Arshad won the bronze. In the 400 m hurdle Lalit won the bronze medal while in Delhi State, Sumit won the gold in high jump. The college cricket team reached the pre-quarter final in the inter college tournament and four of our players have been selected in the DDCA league. The College volley ball and football teams reached the super league. Students also participated in chess and shooting Inter college championships. The Annual sportsmeet of the college witnessed active participation from the students. Mr. Arshad was adjudged the All Round Best Sportsman, and Ms. Sarita Rawat the Best All Round Sportswoman.



**Garden Committee :** As a result of dedicated efforts of teachers and mali's the college won II<sup>nd</sup> prize in potted plants (Annuals) and III<sup>rd</sup> prize in cut flowers (Annuals) categories in the University Annual Flower Show, 2010. The garden has been further improved by planting exotic varieties of plants and flowers and hundreds of climbers have been planted along the boundary wall of the college.

**Placement Cell :** Around 9 companies visited the campus, prominent amongst which were Ernst & Young (E &Y) and Genpact. Around 50 of our students got offers with an average salary of around 2 lacs per annum. Over 150 students enrolled with the Central Placement Cell of the University & participated in the placement drive.
